During vitrectomy surgery, your eye doctor will make very small openings in your eye wall and remove most of the vitreous from your eye with a suction tool. Depending on your treatment plan, your doctor may also: Use a laser or freeze treatment to reattach or repair your retina

A vitrectomy is a surgical procedure that removes the vitreous in the central cavity of the eye so that vision can be corrected. It is beneficial in many eye conditions including diabetic eye disease (diabetic retinopathy), retinal detachments, macular hole, macular pucker and vitreous hemorrhage. Vitreoretinal surgery refers to any operation to treat eye problems involving the retina, macula, and vitreous fluid. These include retinal detachment, macular hole, epiretinal membrane and complications related to diabetic retinopathy.

Vitreo-retinal - Moorfields Eye Hospital

Also called vitrectomy, it is the surgical removal of the vitreous gel from the middle of the eye. Such surgery may be performed if this gel is pulling the retina from its normal position, or if blood and scar tissue are obscuring light passing through to the retina, causing blurred vision.

Surgery to re-attach the retina or fix a retinal tear may involve: removing and replacing the jelly inside your eye (vitrectomy) attaching a small band around your eye to push the wall of your eye and retina closer together (scleral buckling)

Surgery can repair both a retinal tear and a retinal detachment. Macular holes. These happen when the vitreous is firmly affixed to the retina as it pulls away. They cause distorted, blurry vision.

3. Pars plana vitrectomy surgery. In vitrectomy, the vitreous is removed to relieve traction or pulling from the vitreous on the retina. All of the retinal breaks are identified and traction from the vitreous is removed from the breaks in particular. The fluid under the retina is drained through one of the breaks and laser is applied to seal the breaks.

Surgery of the Retina, Vitreous, and Macula - Retina ...

The vitreous is the gel-like fluid that fills your eye. It's full of tiny fibers that attach to your retina (the light-sensitive layer of tissue at the back of the eye). As you get older, the fibers of your vitreous pull away from the retina. This is called vitreous detachment.
